To learn about how black people came up and that they can do the same things as white people. JH


Dear Journal,

Valentine's Winter Snowstorm of 1960 By BU

Usually we get snow in January, but not always. In the winter of 1960, when I was in the sixth grade, we didn't get any measurable snow until almost the middle of February. Most of the winter up until this time had been unseasonably warm, and I had been looking in vain for signs of snow. But on the Friday evening just before Valentine's Day, Miss Mattie Mae Lyon had sponsored a Valentine dance in the gym, which my mother was determined that I should attend because in those days I was pretty much devoid of social life. I had no interest in attending this dance, because my chief interest was the weather at this period of my life. However, once I got to



the dance, I had a good time much to my surprise. There were plenty of girls that were more than willing to dance with me despite the fact that I was shy. When the dance was over and I went back home, Daddy wrote a poem about this experience which started like this:

> "Billy went to a dance So that he would have a chance To take some whirls With the girls."

Though I didn't know it at the time, a winter storm was brewing which would give us the first measurable snowfall of the winter. When I went to bed, I was basking in the romantic glow of my experience at the dance, but when I awoke the next morning, Mama had a surprise for me. She opened the curtains of my bedroom window, and I saw the ground was covered with snow. About two inches had already fallen. As the morning wore on, the snow increased in intensity, and it was accompanied by strong gusty wind which caused some blowing and drifting of the snow. Daddy predicted that this was going to be a really big snowfall, perhaps 8 to 10 inches or more.
